


MILLION NEW ASYLUM CLAIMS

The number of new asylum claims remained high at 2.0 million. With 722,400 such claims, Germany was the world's largest source of new asylum seekers. In total, 1,091 countries received the 2.0 million, with Turkey (704,800), Germany (200,000), Italy (172,000), and France (168,000).

SEPARATED CHILDREN

Unaccompanied or separated children – mostly Afghan and Syrian – lodged 75,000 new asylum applications in 2016, up 20,000 from the year before. Although this figure is remarkable, it must be noted that in recent years, Germany received the highest number of these applications (70,700).

Children below 18 years of age constituted about half of the refugee population in 2016, as in recent years. Children make up an estimated 31 per cent of the total world population.

HOSTED BY DEVELOPING
REGIONS

Developing regions hosted 84 per cent of the world's refugees in 2016. The top five developing regions in terms of refugee numbers were: Turkey (2.9 million), Jordan (0.8 million), Lebanon (0.7 million), the Islamic Republic of Iran (0.7 million), and Jordan (0.6 million).

For the third consecutive year, Turkey hosted the largest number of refugees, with 2.9 million people. It was followed by Jordan (0.8 million), Lebanon (0.7 million), the Islamic Republic of Iran (0.7 million), and Jordan (0.6 million).

TRENDS AT A GLANCE

More than 100 million people were forcibly displaced worldwide in 2016. This figure includes 65.6 million people who had been forced to leave their homes within their country, and 34.4 million people who had sought refuge in another country.

- Libya (4.6%), Jordan (2.1%), and Iraq (1.8%)
- South Sudan (2.4%), South Africa (1.4%), and Kenya (1.1%)






TRENDS AT A GLANCE

Worldwide, the number of newly displaced people increased by 1.3 million in 2016, reaching a total of 65.6 million people, up by 2.0 million, after 5.6 million in 2015.



TRENDS AT A GLANCE

By the end of 2016, 65.6 million individuals were forcibly displaced worldwide as a result of persecution, conflict, violence, or human rights violations. That was an increase of 300,000 people over the previous year, and the world's forcibly displaced population remained at a record high.



75,000 UNACCOMPANIED OR SEPARATED CHILDREN

Unaccompanied or separated children – mainly Afghans, and Syrians – lodged some 75,000 asylum applications in 70 countries during the year, although this figure is assumed to be an underestimate. Germany received the highest number of these applications (35,900).

Altogether, more than half (55 per cent) of all refugees worldwide came from just three countries:


- Syrian Arab Republic (5.5 million)

HOSTED BY DEVELOPING REGIONS

Developing regions hosted 84 per cent of the world's refugees under UNHCR's mandate, with about 14.5 million people. The least developed countries provided asylum to a growing proportion, with 28 per cent of the global total (4.9 million refugees).


Major refugee-hosting countries

For the third consecutive year, Turkey hosted the largest number of refugees worldwide, with 2.9 million people. It was followed by Pakistan (1.4 million), Lebanon (1.0 million), the Islamic Republic of Iran (979,400), Uganda (940,800), and Ethiopia (791,600).











